- 1. Timely notice of the meeting was given to the public by publication, notice and the proposed agenda was timely given to all members of the Board of Trustees, and notice was timely given to the Saunders County Clerk and the Fremont City Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in said notices. These minutes were written and available for public inspection at the office of Woodcliff Lakes, Inc., within ten working days or prior to the next convened meeting, whichever was earlier. It was stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review and the location of the copy of said Act was indicated. After discussion upon roll call vote, voting Yes were Trustees Borman, Langenfeld, Mahrt, Sawyer, and Taylor; voting No were NONE; absent or abstaining were NONE; whereupon the motion was declared adopted by the presiding officer.

It was moved by Trustee Langenfeld, and seconded by trustee Taylor that the following three documents associated with Warrants #39 through #56 should be approved and signed:

IRS 8038-G for total of warrants #39 through #56 for \$407,071.76

Certificate with Respect to Tax Matters for warrants #39 through #56

Certificate with Respect to the August 3, 2020 meeting items.

After discussion upon roll call vote, voting YES were Trustees Borman, Langenfeld, Mahrt, Sawyer, and Taylor; voting NO were NONE; absent or abstaining were NONE; whereupon the motion was declared adopted by the presiding officer, Chairman Mahrt.

5. Jake Miriovsky, Engineer with JEO, submitted Change Order #3 for the Road Raise Project which includes extra rock, two drain locations to the river, 1,400 additional feet on the North end of the current road raise project, and Bank Stabilization next to the current work. This Change Order #3 will bring up the rest of the river road to the 100-year flood plain level. It was moved by Trustee Langenfeld, seconded by Trustee Borman to approve Change Order #3. After discussion upon roll call vote, voting YES were Trustees Borman, Langenfeld, Mahrt, Sawyer, and Taylor; voting NO were None, absent or abstaining were None; whereupon the motion was declared adopted by the presiding officer.

Discussion was held about the ramp to access the river owned by Patrick Poehling and providing two other areas to access the river. The Board asked Attorney Hartmann to investigate liability, the possibility of providing indemnity to Poehling, and possibly expanding the current easement for SID #8 to allow river access.

Miriovsky presented copies of the Stormwater Management Plan – Phase 2; this will be reviewed and discussed at a future meeting.

Kent Speicher presented a preliminary budget for fiscal year 2020-2021. Levies would be set at \$0.102 for the General Fund, \$0.06 for the Sinking Fund, and \$0.09 for the Bond Fund. The Board asked Speicher to finalize the budget upon receipt of the Valuations and set up Levy and Budget Hearings for Monday, September 14, 2020, at 5:00pm at the Community Center. A general meeting will be scheduled following the hearings.

A letter from the Nebraska Dept. of Health & Human Services was reviewed. It indicated that the Action Level for Copper was exceeded in June testing. Duane Grashorn at PeopleService will be contacted for help with the second round of tests.

Copies of the Financial Reports through fiscal year-end June 30, 2020 and through July 31, 2020 were available.

#### 6. Old Business - NONE.

### 7. New Business

S1205 reported a drain tube to the lake left road debris in the lake at the end of the tube which is currently plugged. Sawyer Construction will clean this out as soon as possible.

Outback Construction has been called by Miriovsky to repair a drain tube at the end of Airport Road which was damaged as Outback worked in the area.

S1001 has a drainage issue due to the new berm. Miriovsky, Sawyer, and Langenfeld have all checked it out. Sand will be brought in to cover the clay on their property. Grass will be established on the berm which should eliminate soil movement.

Langenfeld and Ray Dengel were thanked for their work installing bollards and yellow rope fencing along the river road.

It was reported that S51 has a drainage issue due to a plugged drain and that S49 is the property to be included in the Storm Water Management Plan.

Whereupon a Motion for Adjournment was made by \_Trustee Langenfeld\_, seconded by Trustee Taylor\_\_, and on roll call vote was unanimously approved by the Chairman and all Trustees, and declared duly adopted by the presiding officer, at which point the meeting adjourned.

In connection with such meeting, the undersigned, being the Chairperson and Clerk of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 8 of Saunders County, Nebraska (the "District") and hereby certify as follows:

- 1. That the Board of Trustees of the District and the District hereby find and determine and covenant, and warrant and agree that (a) the facilities for which the above Warrants are issued are for essential governmental functions and are designed to serve members of the general public on an equal basis; (b) there are no persons with rights to use said facilities other than as members of the general public: (c) ownership and operation of said facilities is within the District or another political subdivision; (d) none of the proceeds of the Warrants will be loaned to any person and to the extent that special assessments have been or are to be levied for any said facilities, such special assessments have been or are to be levied under Nebraska law as a matter of general application to all property specially benefited by such facilities in the District; (e) the development of the land in the District is for residential or commercial use; (f) the development of the land in the District for sale and occupation by the general public is proceeding with reasonable speed; and (g) the District hereby authorizes and directs the Chairman or Clerk to file, when due, an information reporting form pursuant to Section 149(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, pertaining to the above Warrants.
- 2. That the Board of Trustees of the District hereby covenants, warrants and agrees as follows: (a) to take all actions necessary under current federal law to maintain the tax exempt status (as to taxpayers generally) of interest on the above Warrants; and (b) to the extent that it may lawfully do so, the District hereby designates the above Warrants as its "qualified tax exempt obligations" under Section 265(b)(3)(8)(i)(III) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and covenants and warrants that the District does not reasonably expect to issue warrants or bonds or other obligations aggregating in the principal amount of more than \$10,000,000 during the calendar year in which the above Warrants are to be issued.
- 3. That the Board of Trustees of and the District and the Chairman and Clerk of the District hereby further certify, as of the date of the registration of the above Warrants with the County Treasurer of Saunders County, Nebraska, as follows:
  - A. No separate reserve or replacement fund has been or will be established with respect to the above Warrants. The District reasonably anticipates that monies in its Bond Fund reasonably attributable to the above Warrants in excess

of the lesser of: (a) ten percent (10%) of the net principal proceeds of the above Warrants, (b) the maximum annual debt service due on the above Warrants, or (c) one hundred twenty-five percent (125%) of average annual debt service due on the above Warrants will be expended for payment of principal of and interest on the above Warrants within thirteen (13) months after receipt of such monies. That amount which is currently held in the District's Bond Fund which exceeds the amount which is to be expended for payment of principal and interest on the above Warrants within thirteen (13) months after receipt of such monies, plus that amount arrived at pursuant to the immediately preceding sentence, will not be invested in any securities or any other investment obligations which bear a yield, as computed in accordance with the actuarial method, in excess of the yield on the above Warrants.

- B. To the best of their knowledge, information and belief, the above expectations are reasonable.
- C. The District has not been notified of any listing of it by the Internal Revenue Service as an issuer that may not certify its bonds.
